Globally, 2014 has been a banner year for girl's education and children's rights exemplified by Malala Yousafzai and Kailash Satyarthi winning the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize. In India, Narindra Modi prioritized education for all and the pledge is made possible with the implementation the of the 2013 India Companies Act, mandating minimum corporate spending on social responsibility(CSR) initiatives. With global momentum adding wind to our sails, KAP is ready to meet the challenge of educating India's underserved children, especially girls.

In 2014, KAP added two new board members, Sonia Kohli and Nita Talwar, and said good-bye to Kim Cash. It was a bustling year of fundraising and awareness events. SPONSORED PROGRAM

Wings School for Girls Hyderabad, India

Wings provides a free, quality education for 150 girls from some of the poorest families in the region. The program includes:

- ◆ Free nutritious breakfast & lunch.
- ◆ English medium CBSE curriculum through 5th grade & supplemented state curriculum through 10 grade graduation
- ◆ Extracurricular activities like music, art, dance, drama, and martial arts classes.

We are proud that Wings will have their first batch of graduates in 2015. Seventy percent of Indian girls drop out of school by age 15. They leave school to support their families or are forced into child marriage. Secondary school boosts a girl's income by 15-25%. These girls will take their state exams and apply for intermediate college. KAP is working with the Wings administration to develop a scholarship program for 11th and 12th grades.
